The Girl Scout Leadership Experience

Girls at every level of Girl Scouting participate in the "leadership experience." A leadership experience is an exciting way of working with girls in a series of themed activities focused on building leadership skills. By enlisting the three keys to leadership (*Discover, Connect*, and *Take Action*) girls learn that they can take the lead to make a difference in their community and the world. The three keys are at the heart of the Girl Scout philosophy of leadership:

Discover

Girls understand themselves and their values and use their knowledge and skills to explore the world.

Connect

Girls care about, inspire, and team with others locally and globally.

Take Action Girls act to make the world a better place.

It's not just "what" girls do, but "how." When girls are engaged that creates a high-quality Girl Scout leadership experience. All Girl Scout experiences are built on three processes (*Girl-Led*, *Cooperative Learning*, and *Learning by Doing*) that make Girl Scouting different from school and other extra-curricular activities. When used together, these processes ensure the quality and promote the fun and friendship so integral to Girl Scouting.

Girl-Led

Girls play an active role in the planning and implementation of activities while adults provide age-appropriate facilitation, ensuring that planning, organization, set-up, and evaluation of all activities are done jointly with the girls.

Cooperative Learning

All members of a group work together towards a common goal that can only be accomplished with the help of others.

Learn by Doing

A "hands-on" learning process that engages girls in cycles of action and reflection resulting in deeper understanding of concepts and mastery of practical skills.

When Discover, Connect, and Take Action activities are girl-led and involve learning by doing and cooperative learning, girls achieve the desired and expected leadership outcomes ultimately resulting in Girl Scouting achieving its mission: **Building girls of courage**, **confidence and character**, **who make the world a better place**.





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Local Government





The Judge Keeps It Fair and Impartial

The Judge presides over the courtroom, hears evidence, makes decisions on motions, instructs juries and makes rulings. The judge is responsible for assuring the law is followed and carried out in every case. Judges read through court documents and may research legal issues. You may one day go to law school and eventually be a municipal court judge.

This activity will be a great one for camp or a weekend.

Materials: Number of materials is contingent on the desires and number of girls participating and is only limited by the girls' imagination and location.

For this activity you can conduct a mock trial. Adapt the "The Big Bad Wolf vs. The Three Little Pigs" (link included below) however works for you and your troop.

You will need to decide who will play which role in the trial. You could invite a law student, lawyer or even a judge to be the judge in your trial. It is up to you how detailed you want your mock trial to be.

Municipal Matters: Keeping the City Running

We are a nation of laws and we have lots of them! City, county, state and federal laws require city officials to do (or not do) something. The municipal or city attorney is the person that analyzes all new legislation and figures how it will impact life or governing in San Antonio. The City Attorney is the chief legal advisor to the City Council, City management, and all City departments.

The Office of the City Attorney is divided into different divisions:

Commercial Division Litigation Division Prosecution Division Regulatory Division

The Commercial Division of the City Attorney's Office provides legal services to all City departments requiring expertise in a variety of legal fields including real estate, construction, economic development, finance, budget, hospitality, information technology, employment, entertainment and procurement.

If you are interested in business or law, you might work in the Commercial Division of the City Attorney's Office. The city has contracts with many different businesses throughout the city. Some examples are garbage collection, rental property, cleaning services and food service. The city awards contracts to businesses for specific projects such as road construction or repair.

The Procurement Section reviews all proposed contracts with the city. They make sure that all contracts are awarded fairly and for the best price.

On this web site you can see some of the contracts that are available for people to bid on. The city uses a bidding process. The contractor reads what the city wants done and then the contractor figures out how much money it will take to fulfill the contract. The city reviews it and picks the one they think will do the best job but cost the least. Once the contract is awarded, the municipal attorneys write the contract and make sure that everything is fair and legal.

City - County - State- Know and Explore Your Government

Texas is divided into counties and within these counties are cities. Understanding the difference between state, county and city is important to all citizens.

San Antonio has a Council-Manager form of city government. The City Council is composed of 10 members elected by districts and a Mayor elected at-large. All serve up to four two-year terms. The City Council sets policies and the City Manager is the city's chief executive officer.

Public Health & Safety





Healthy Teeth. Healthy Person. Dental Hygienist

Dental hygienists or dental assistants clean teeth, examine patients for signs of oral diseases such as gingivitis and provide other preventive dental care. They also educate patients about oral health. If you like biology and medicine, you may want to work as a dental hygienist for the San Antonio Metropolitan Health District.

For this activity, you have the opportunity to learn and explore oral health and being a dental hygienist. Oral health is essential to general health and well-being at every stage of life. A healthy mouth enables not only nutrition of the physical body, but also enhances social interaction and promotes self-esteem and feelings of well-being. The mouth serves as a "window" to the rest of the body, providing signals of general health disorders. Oral conditions have an impact on overall health and disease. Bacteria from the mouth can cause infection in other parts of the body when the immune system has been compromised by disease or medical treatments.

Keeping our Parks and Recreation Areas Safe

Are you interested in law enforcement and safety? You may want to consider a career with the San Antonio Park Police. San Antonio Park Police offers a diverse opportunity of assignments. Officers can be assigned to the Riverwalk Patrol Section, District Patrol Section, Bike/ATV Unit, Public/Community Relations, Covert Operations, Training Academy, San Antonio City Hall, or one of several administrative positions.

San Antonio Park Police protect people while they are out enjoying nature and the City's parks. The San Antonio Park Police operates a 13-week advanced academy for all newly hired Park Police Officers.

The Academy covers:

- · Report Writing,
- Public/Community Relations,
- Penal Law,
- Police Tactics,
- High Performance Driving, and
- State mandated courses such as:
 - o Cultural Diversity,
 - o Crises Intervention Training, and
 - o Advanced Firearms Training and Qualification

Firefighters

San Antonio firefighters don't just respond to fires. Firefighters respond to medical emergencies, motor vehicle crashes, aircraft crashes, trench cave-ins, building collapses, hazardous materials incidents, civil disturbances, technical rescues, explosions, tornadoes, earthquakes and terrorist attacks.

Did you know that approximately 50% of home fire deaths occur in homes without smoke alarms? San Antonio Fire Department (SAFD) believes smoke detectors are a key factor in preventing fire-related deaths. The SAFD has a Smoke Detector Program that offers free smoke detectors, including installation, to citizens living in single family homes in San Antonio. So far, SAFD has installed tens of thousands of smoke detectors throughout San Antonio, saving countless lives.

World Heritage: San Antonio Heritage

Are you interested in the tourism industry and the history and culture of South-Central Texas?

One day you may want to work in the World Heritage Office. Tourism is an exciting industry and San Antonio has a lot of opportunities for tourists. The tourism industry brings in visitors that spend money eating in restaurants, staying in hotels, riding in taxis, buying souvenirs and paying to visit museums, theaters and many other places in San Antonio. This helps business owners and the city of San Antonio because these tourists spend money to buy goods and services from the businesses and pay hotel and sales taxes to the city.

The World Heritage Office promotes the San Antonio landmarks by maximizing the economic impact of the World Heritage status designation and enhancing the experience for visitors and residents through the implementation of the World Heritage Work Plan and related projects within the World Heritage Buffer Zone.

Mission Marquee Plaza:

The Mission Marquee Plaza opened in 2014. The facility is located on the Southside of San Antonio. The area is rich in history and culture and is considered to be one of San Antonio's iconic gems. For generations, many families locally and from the South-Central Texas region gathered to watch movies when it served as a drive-in theater.

Today, Mission Marquee, with its large stage and screen, serves the community as a meeting place to enjoy various outdoor activities throughout the year including festivals, film screenings, arts & culture events, open-air markets and more.

Spanish Governor's Palace:

This National Historic Landmark represents the last visual remnants of the Presidio San Antonio de Béjar. Traditionally known as the Spanish Governor's Palace, it was the original comandancia (residence and working office) for the captains of the military garrison from 1722 until the early 1800s.

Keeping San Antonio International Airport Running

Airports are smaller versions of cities. Restaurants, clothing stores, fire, police, and medical staff, custodians, transportation and communication technicians all exist at the airport. Airport managers have to work with airline companies and surrounding communities.

The airport manager's job is to keep the airport running as smoothly as possible. Airport managers sign leases with airlines and concessionaires. They forecast needs and plan for the future growth of their airport. They are responsible for large budgets, prepare for emergencies and deal with foul weather.

Airport managers deal with safety rules and security issues designed to prevent terrorism. It is important to understand environmental and ecological matters. Storm water management, noise pollution and air quality are all areas that an airport manager has to understand and address while running an airport.

Telecommunications Engineer: Bringing the World Closer

One day you may be a City of San Antonio Telecommunications Engineer!

Telecommunications engineering combines electrical and computer engineering to support and enhance telecommunication systems. A telecommunication engineer is responsible for designing and overseeing the installation of telecommunications equipment in facilities, such as complex electronic switching systems, telephone service, optical fiber cabling, IP networks, and microwave transmission systems. Telecommunication engineering also overlaps with broadcast engineering.

The Telephone Network:

The public switched telephone network is the worldwide telephone system that handles voice-oriented telephone calls. Nearly the entire telephone network today uses digital technology. The only exception is your home phone, which often is analog.

Materials: Number of materials is contingent on the desires and number of girls participating.
