





## 9 Ways for Troop Leaders to Have a Successful Year in Girl Scouts

Whether you have been a Girl Scout leader for years, have been with one troop for a little while, or are just starting, it can be tough to know where to begin. We asked Girl Scout troop leaders, parents, and volunteers what their best tips are for launching the new troop year, and their answers did not disappoint!

USE YOUR SUPPORT SYSTEM. Connect with the service unit in your area so you know when its meetings will be. You can also talk to other Girl Scout leaders, get information about what's happening locally, and build your support network. Your local Girl Scout council is a great resource! Get help, ask questions and more by calling us at 800-624-4185. Please leave a message if we are busy helping another member. We try to return all calls within the hour. LOG ON. The Volunteer Toolkit, the official GSUSA online source for program content and related resources and troop financial management support, is a digital planning tool that helps you set up, customize and track your troop activities and achievements. Everything in the Volunteer Toolkit is fully customizable. You can add your own troop activities and change their order with a quick drag-and-drop. You can also report on troop finances, access your girl and family roster and track your girls' achievements and attendance.

**KEEP IT GIRL-LED.** The best way for girls to learn leadership is through girl-led experiences. There is a fine line between girl-led success and girl-led chaos, but taking a step back to let your girls take the lead is where magic happens.

**GET ORGANIZED.** Some Girl Scout troop leaders find it extremely helpful to have all the information a parent may need in a folder, such as the troop meeting schedule, necessary forms, and troop guidelines. Better yet, get ahead of troop communication issues.

GET PARENTS INVOLVED. Setting clear expectations and creating a troop committee is key for a successful year. If you have a larger troop, these four essentials for managing a large troop are a must. Nervous about having your first parent meeting? Girl Scout leaders shared their top tips for running a successful parent meeting.

#### INTRODUCE GIRLS TO HOW THEY CAN INFLUENCE THEIR

**COMMUNITY.** When girls are passionate about something, they can do incredible things to make positive changes in their community through community service and Take Action projects. There are also many things you can do to build community partnerships with your troop.

**GO OUTDOORS.** A change of scenery can be just what girls need to learn through hands-on activities. If you're looking for ideas to get outside, check out these tips for getting your Girl Scout troop outdoors this fall. Don't forget to leave no trace!

REMIND YOUR GIRL SCOUTS THAT IT'S OK TO FAIL. Girl Scouts allows girls to try new things, and sometimes they don't always go as planned. But those happy accidents can turn into the fondest memories. Learning alongside your girls can be a great way to show them that making mistakes is part of the process. Check out our tips for boosting your confidence in program areas that you might be intimidated by and how you can find local experts for Girl Scout activities.

One of these is titled Scuba & Sea Turtle Adventure—an unforgettable experience featuring wildlife conservation learning, exciting outdoor activities, and even scuba diving certification! Part of <u>Girl Scouts' Destinations program</u> and the ultimate experience for Cadette, Senior, and Ambassador Girl Scouts, Scuba & Sea Turtle Adventure is perfect for bold and courageous lovers of animals and the outdoors.

This life-changing experience is supported in part by the Elliott Wildlife Values Project, which helps girls grow as leaders in wildlife conservation and environmental stewardship—efforts that positively affect their communities and the world.

Girls who've experienced Scuba & Sea Turtle Adventure have also shared that learning about wildlife on their Destinations trip inspired them to help others protect and conserve wildlife back home. And as noted in the Girl Scout Research Institute resource Four Ways Girl Scouts Builds Girl Leaders in the Outdoors (2019), having outdoor recreational experiences in early childhood strongly and positively influences people's

environmental attitudes, values, and behaviors, with activities like hiking and camping, cultivating a sense of responsibility for nature.

Going on a Girl Scout Destinations trip is an incredible way girls can develop love and respect for the environment—as they discover new places, jump into challenges, learn a ton, and make awesome lifelong friends.

There are 40+ Destinations posted for 2020-2021. Applications are open – Round 1 applications are due December 1.

## Happy Birthday Juliette



On October 31, we celebrate the birthday of Juliette Gordon Low, a pioneering woman from Savannah, Georgia, who more than a century ago started the Girl Scout Movement. As the founder of the largest girl leadership development organization in the world, Juliette had, and through her legacy continues to have, an extraordinary influence on the lives of millions of girls across the country.

Juliette "Daisy" Gordon Low assembled 18 girls from Savannah on March 12, 1912, for a local Girl Scout meeting. She believed that all girls should be given the opportunity to develop physically, mentally, and spiritually. With the goal of bringing girls out of isolated home environments and into community service and the open air, Girl Scouts hiked, played basketball, went on camping trips, learned how to tell time by the stars, and studied first aid.

The legacy that Juliette Gordon Low left is Girl Scouts, an organization that has nearly 2 million girl members and 800,000 adult members, including volunteers who help set girls up for a lifetime of leadership and success.

Indeed, our alumnae, currently more than 59 million strong, are high achievers: all three female U.S. secretaries of state were Girl Scouts in their youth, as were the majority of women in the U.S. Congress and state legislatures nationwide, most women in business, and the first American woman to walk in space.
