Girl Award Money Earning Policy

Money earning activities are activities carried out by girls to earn money for the troop treasury. The number of money earning activities may not exceed the amount of money needed to support group activities. In order to participate in any money earning activities, girls MUST participate in both the fall and spring product sales. Money earning activities cannot take place during council sponsored product sales.

Council approval is required from the Vice President of Fund Development <u>at least three</u> weeks before the proposed money-earning event!!

Safety-Wise provides groups/troops with specific guidelines to be used in planning and doing money-earning activities. Money-earning activities must be program based and will not involve sale of a commercial product or games of chance or lottery.

Girl Scouts, in their Girl Scout capacities, may not solicit money for other organizations. Girl members may support other organizations through service projects ONLY. All fundraising methods employed by Girl Scout groups must be in keeping with the principles for which the organization stands.

When girls are planning Girl Scout Gold Award projects or special service projects that require funds beyond the group treasury, they will develop proposals that must be approved by fund development before individuals or community businesses are solicited. The girl(s) must make the presentation to potential funders and the registered and appointed adult must make the request.
