Badge Overview

As a Girl Scout Brownie, you're part of a sisterhood. Brownies all over the world share traditions and do good things to make the world a better place. In this badge, try some special Brownie traditions (some that Girl Scouts have been sharing for 100 years!) — and, of course, have a world of Brownie fun.

Badge Components

1. Sing everywhere

Girl Scout songs are a tradition, and you can sing them around the campfire or in one of your troop meetings.

- Earn this step by learning some new Girl Scout songs with this GSUSA <u>blog post</u>, or brush up on your skills if you knew the songs before! Don't forget to switch sides and try the pose on the other side!
- O BONUS! Next time you connect with your Brownie sisters, teach them one of the songs and sing it together.

2. Celebrate Juliette Low's birthday

Juliette Gordon Low, whose nickname was "Daisy," founded Girl Scouts in 1912. She was on October 31st, and loved having her birthday on Halloween!

O Even though it might not be her birthday today, earn this step by creating a birthday card for Juliette. Don't forget to write a note inside to Juliette herself!

3. Share sisterhood

All of the girls and women in Girl Scouts work to live the Girl Scout Promise and Law together, and this is what brings us all together in one great sisterhood.

- O Earn this step by drawing or painting a picture showing what your favorite thing to do with your Girl Scouts sisters is.
- O BONUS! Next time you connect with your Brownie sisters, show them your picture and ask what their favorite thing is.

4. Leave a place better than you found it

Girl Scouts always leave a place better than they found it, whether it is outdoors or indoors.

- O Earn this step by picking a room each day of the week and doing something to leave it better than you found it.
 - o Are there shoes by the door or clothes on the floor you can put away?
 - o Does your bookshelf need organizing?
 - o Do you need to make your bed?

5. Enjoy Girl Scout traditions

Girl Scouts have many traditions from throughout the years, and they have been earning badges through it all! One badge introduced in 1913 was the Signaling badge, where girls learned to send and receive messages using semaphore and morse code signaling systems.

- Earn this step by learning your name in morse code and drawing it out with the help of this graphic!
- O BONUS! Next time you connect with your Brownie sisters, show them your morse code name and encourage them to learn their own name.
