<p>Chosita and the Brownie friends get fresh air and exercise when they play together outside. . .</p> <p>Some children in our community don't get enough exercise.</p>	<p>Organize some “Family Fitness” gatherings.</p>	<p>They get more families into fitness, through a photo exhibit in the town hall or at a kiosk at the local park.</p> <p>Or they create a postcard campaign to send fun exercise tips to families in their neighborhood.</p>
<p>Chosita shares slices of fruit with the Brownie friends . . .</p> <p>Some students in our school don't eat healthy snacks.</p>	<p>Organize a “Healthy Food Fair,” with games and food-tasting stations (and make-your-own <i>bento</i> boxes!) at school.</p>	<p>They create recipe cards with healthful snacks and hand them out at school or to other Girl Scouts.</p>
