Department Cards

<p><i>Department Card</i></p> <p>Police Department</p> <p>Police officers provide protection to the general public. They work for local or state police departments and perform a variety of duties, including patrolling neighborhoods, directing traffic and investigating crimes.</p>	<p><i>Department Card</i></p> <p>Fire Department</p> <p>The main duties of a full-time firefighter are to help protect the public in emergency situations. They respond to a wide variety of calls, such as car crashes, chemical spills, flooding, water rescue and general rescue as well as fires.</p>
<p><i>Department Card</i></p> <p>Water and Sanitation Department</p> <p>The water and sanitation department are responsible for maintaining safe water and sanitation systems for all local residents. Many of these systems are computerized, to allow for remote maintenance and observation.</p>	<p><i>Department Card</i></p> <p>City Court System</p> <p>Most city courts maintain digital records. Rarely are files kept in hard copy form. This provides for the easy transfer of information from one district to another or for easy release to and support of local and national law enforcement agencies.</p>

<p><i>Department Card</i></p> <p>Department of Education</p> <p>Local and state public departments of education are responsible for the delivery of a quality education to all citizens. This includes the maintenance of student records and grades, as well as the security of testing instruments and protection of private data.</p>	<p><i>Department Card</i></p> <p>Parks and Recreation Department</p> <p>Department typically responsible for maintaining parks and ecological diversity and furnishing recreational opportunities. This can include parks, playgrounds and recreation facilities, playgrounds, playing fields, tennis courts, major recreation centers, pools, beaches, and golf courses.</p>
<p><i>Department Card</i></p> <p>Public Transportation System</p> <p>Most city public transportation systems includes services like bus, rail, and subway systems. Some larger systems include airports and sea ports. These systems are also responsible for the operators of the vehicles and vessels within the system as well as the passengers and cargo.</p>	<p><i>Department Card</i></p> <p>Mayor</p> <p>The mayor is an elected position in all cities. The mayor is typically responsible for overseeing the various departments. This includes advising on day to day operations, budget decisions, and any safety or emergency situations that arise.</p>
