Activity Choice Descriptions

Walk your girls through the activity choices and let them decide which ones they like best.

Draw a Bug Poster

Talk to a Bug Specialist in Your Town or Community: Learn about bugs from a specialist. Then pick one bug and create a poster explaining what you found out.

With an Adult's Help, Find Websites about Your Bug: Learn about bugs you are interested in through online research. Then pick one bug and create a poster explaining what you found out.

Read a Book or Watch a Video about Your Bug: Watch videos on different types of bugs. Then pick one bug and create a poster explaining what you found out.

See Bugs in Action

Watch Three Bugs: Look for three different bugs in your area. Identify the bugs and try to find out what they are doing and why!

With an Adult, Find an Ant Trail: Figure out how you can distract the ants from their trail without hurting them. What happens if you put a stick in the middle of the trail? What about a little water or food?

Make a Bug Box: Create a bug box out of a cardboard shoe box to take a closer look at bugs in action. See how they interact with the home you've created for them.

MEETING 3 ACTIVITY CHOICES

Take a Bug Field Trip

Visit a Farm: Farms have lots of animals and crops, so they can be a great place to see bugs. Bring a magnifying glass to help you spot them in action. Ask a farmer why bugs can be useful to crops, and what their favorite bug on the farm is.

Take a Bug Walk or Bug Hike: See how many kinds of bugs you can find along the way. Use a magnifying glass and look on the ground and up high in the branches.

Visit a Museum, Zoo, or Botanical Garden with a Bug Collection: Look at the bugs. How are they grouped? What is the strangest bug in the collection? If there's a live insect viewing where you can hold the bugs, you could give it a try!
