Project Idea: Make a Quilt Inspired by Folk Art

Recommended for Step 4: Make art about a subject, Choice 2: Create art about your world

Setup: Quilts are blankets made by sewing together pieces of cloth. Sometimes they have patterns or pictures that can tell a story or even the history of a community. Folk art often shows ideas and things that are important to the maker's community. For example, a quilt inspired by folk art might show a common experience, such as a community celebration. It might show a map of the community or explore the community's history, such as the rise of factories or other industries that are important to the community.

Materials needed:

- Colored and/or patterned paper or cloth
- Large piece of paper
- Safety scissors
- Glue or tape

- Paper
- Pencil
- Markers, crayons, or colored pencils

Activity:

- 1. Look at the pieces of colored paper or cloth. Brainstorm how you can use them to make a pattern or picture. Think about the sample quilts you've seen. What story will you tell?
- 2. Sketch your idea on the smaller paper. The larger paper will be the back of your quilt.
- 3. Cut pieces of colored paper or cloth and lay them on the large piece of paper to create your quilt.
- **4.** When your design is ready, glue or tape the pieces to the large piece of paper.
- 5. Use markers, crayons, or colored pencils to add decoration. This will look like colored thread on your guilt.
