MEETING 2 ACTIVITY CHOICES

Share Sisterhood

Make a Time Capsule: Collect items that show Girl Scout values: perhaps photos, souvenirs, stories you've written, drawings, poems, or patches. Put them in a waterproof container and decide on a special place for your time capsule.

Scouts' Own Sisterhood: Share a Scouts' Own. The theme is the Girl Scout Law, but how you share your ceremony, reflection, and celebration is all up to you!

Sisters Across Time: Try a historic badge activity from one of the badges that shares or spreads the ideals from the Law. Then share how the activity helped you live the Law.

Enjoy Girl Scout Traditions!

Try a Tradition from the Past: Find a woman in your community who was a Girl Scout when she was your age. Talk to her about her favorite traditions from her time and share one of your favorite traditions with her.

Create a Game About Girl Scout Traditions: Make up a game that uses one or more of the Girl Scout traditions. Teach or share the game.

Start a Dez Chain Story: Check out Dez the spider in any Junior Leadership Journey. Then write the beginning or a story about her. Share the beginning of the story with another troop for them to add to it. See how long the chain story can grow!

Leave a Place Better Than You Found It

Improve Part of a Park in Your Community: Get permission from the person in charge of the park to leave it better than you found it. Maybe you can pick up trash, sort recyclables, or weed and water the plants.

Tackle a Problem in Your Neighborhood: Identify a problem at your school, place of worship, library, or another neighborhood place, and do something to solve it.

Make a Walking Tour for Your Community: Find out about the history of some buildings you find noteworthy in your community. Put together a walking tour of these buildings. Give your tour to friends or to your town's visitor's bureau.
