Code Word Cards

Codeword:

RENEGADE

Used by: the Secret Service **Meaning:** President Obama

Codeword:

CODE OSCAR

Used by: sailors Meaning: Man overboard

Codeword:

DOCTOR FIRESTONE

Used by: Medical personnel
Meaning: Fire
Sample Usage: "Paging Dr. Firestone to
the fifth floor" means there is a possible
fire on the fifth floor.

Codeword:

CODE ADAM

Used by: all federal buildings; many department stores, hospitals, etc. **Meaning:** There is a missing child

Codeword:

CODE 10

Used by: Walmart
Meaning: There has been a spill of dry
goods

Codeword:

CODE BLUE

Used by: Medical personnel **Meaning:** A patient is in cardiac arrest

Codeword:

10-1

Used by: Radio operators **Meaning:** Bad reception

Codeword:

NORA

Used by: public places, like malls and convention centers

Meaning: "Need officer right away"
(used to call law enforcement without anyone noticing)



Codeword:

PAN-PAN

Used by: pilots, ship captains
Meaning: state of urgency on a ship
or aircraft (i.e. engine problems)
Sample usage: "Pan-Pan, Pan-Pan,
Pan-Pan," then the location of the
vehicle, the type of problem and
assistance needed

Codeword:

CODE 3

Used by: emergency responders (police, firefighters, EMTs)

Meaning: Drive with lights and sirens on

Codeword:

CODE 10

Used by: store cashiers

Meaning: Suspicious credit card
that needs to be verified by the
credit card company

Codeword:

7500

Used by: pilots
Meaning: The plane has been
hijacked

Codeword:

ECHO, ECHO, ECHO

Used by: ship captains **Meaning:** two ships are about to collide

Codeword:

10-50

Used by: police officers **Meaning:** auto accident, property damage only, no injuries reported

Codeword:

CODE BRAVO

Used by: airport employees **Meaning:** a major security breach or bomb threat at the airport
