

The Screenplay Form

Screenplays are written in a very precise format that includes information for the actor, the director, and the camera people.

ACTION:

Describe what's happening on-screen.

Capitalize and center the CHARACTER

name over their dialogue. SLUG LINES tell where and when each scene takes place. Use a new one whenever time or location changes. "INT" is used for interior scenes, and "EXT" for exterior. Time is usually DAY or NIGHT.

INT. BIG TOWN THEATER-DAY

Shy Understudy paces across the stage, shouting into her cell phone. Behind her, a carpenter is building the set, HAMMERING.

SHY UNDERSTUDY Mom, I can't believe Wanda is sick! She won't be back

for three whole weeks.

(listens) My big chance? Yeah, but everyone will be watching me. I wish I'd never agreed to be an understudy. Why did you make me?

STAGE MANAGE

Capitalize

SOUND EFFECTS

to be added to the sound track.

Indent DIALOGUE to set it apart from the action.

Put STAGE DIRECTIONS for the actor in parentheses.

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
